NOTICE TO PLAYERS

FORMAT: Match Play

TEES: Blue Tee's – Open Division,
Red Tee's – Women's Division

2019 Rules of Golf will govern all play, supplemented by the HSGA Hardcard and this NTP.
Unless otherwise noted, the penalty for breach of a Local Rule is the general penalty.

LOCAL RULES

1. **Flagstick:** Must remain in the hole at all times and must not be removed by players or caddies.
1st violation – **Warning**, 2nd violation – **General Penalty**, 3rd violation - **Disqualification**
2. **Pace of Play:** Will be strictly monitored, see pace of play policy on reverse side.
3. **Transportation:** Players may use a golf cart during the qualifier, no more than two carts per group and two people per cart.
4. **No play zones:** Play is prohibited from the following flowerbeds and are No play zones; left of #3 championship tee, next to restroom on #4 tee & area around #14 tee.
5. **Retaining walls of tees and penalty areas:** are integral parts of the course, no free relief.
6. **Penalty Areas:** Pond in front of #6 tee is a yellow penalty area playing #6 and a red penalty area playing #3 or #5. Penalty area in front of #18 tee is a red penalty area playing #17.
7. **Dropping Zones:** As an additional option, drop zones are available behind greens #1 & #8.
8. **Suspension of Play:** In the event play is suspended, one long horn blast will signal players to discontinue play immediately. Two short horn blasts will signal players to resume play.

TERMS OF THE COMPETITION

The competition is final when the trophy has been presented to the winner. The result of a match is final when the Committee has approved the result as posted on the public scoreboard.

All scores will be posted by the HSGA to GHIN.

PACE OF PLAY POLICY

The Rules of Golf require that a player shall at all times play without delay.

- ❖ Individual match play groups will be required to play in a **MAXIMUM** time of 3 hours and 36 minutes for the 18 hole round. Allotted time is as follows:
 - *Par 3's- 10min, Par 4's- 12min, Par 5's- 14min
- ❖ The first group to start will be considered "out of position" if, at any time during the round, the group's cumulative time exceeds the time allowed for the number of holes played. Any following group will be considered out of position if:
 - 1) a par 4 or par 5 hole is open before the group reaches the teeing area of that hole
 - 2) and has exceeded the time allowed for the number of holes played.
- ❖ The maximum time allocated per stroke is 40 seconds. The timing of a player will start when a player has had sufficient time to reach the ball, it is his turn to play and he is able to play without interference or distraction. Time taken to determine distance and select a club will count as time taken for the next stroke.

On the putting green, timing will start when the player has had a reasonable amount of time to lift, clean and replace the ball, repair damage that interferes with the line of play and move loose impediments on the line of play. Time spent looking at the line of play from beyond the hole and/or behind the ball will count as part of the time taken for the next stroke.

Note: 10 extra seconds are allowed for the first player to play:

- 1) A tee shot on a par 3 hole
- 2) An approach shot to the green and
- 3) A chip or putt

- Penalty for first breach: One-stroke penalty
- Penalty for second breach: Additional two-stroke penalty
- Penalty for third breach: DISQUALIFICATION
