NOTICE TO PLAYERS: The Rules of Golf as approved by the United States Golf Association and R&A Rules Limited govern play. This Information Supplements the Local Rules and Conditions of Competition for 2022 USGA Championships

Format of Play: 18-Holes Stroke play Tees: USGA tee markers Qualifying Spots Available: 2



<u>Out of Bounds</u>: Defined by white stakes, lines, and inside edges of property walls/fences. *The faded white line on the cart path behind of holes #1 and #4 are to be disregarded. The flower beds behind of those greens are General Area.*

General Area: Areas of wood chips, coral, and flower beds are General area unless marked otherwise.

Immovable obstructions close to putting greens (Model local rule F-5): For a ball in the *General Area*, player may take relief under rule 16.1b if an immovable obstruction is on the *line of play*, is within 2 club lengths of the green, and within 2 club lengths of the ball (must meet all conditions).

Transportation: All players *must walk* for the qualifier, but use of a golf cart for caddies will be allowed.

One ball rule (Model local rule G-4): In effect see USGA Hardcard

Grooves and punch mark specifications (Model local rule G-2): In effect, see USGA Hardcard

<u>Pace of play:</u> The maximum time to play each shot is 40 seconds. See chart on scorecard for **maximum** time allowed per hole, and the HSGA Pace of Play Policy on the reverse side of page.

<u>Ties:</u> In the event of a tie for the qualifier(s) place or an alternate's place, there will immediately be a hole-by hole playoff as determined by the Tournament Committee. Please plan your travel arrangements accordingly.

<u>Returning Scorecard: 3.3b:</u> A player has returned their scorecard when he/she completely leaves the designated scoring area marked by paint, tape, or rope.

Score posting: All scores will be posted to the GHIN system by the HSGA.

Final decisions on any disputed points will be made by the Tournament Committee.

Hawaii State Golf Association: Championship Pace of Play Policy

The Rules Committee of the Hawaii State Golf Association will monitor the Pace of Play as follows:

The **maximum** time allotted to complete each hole and the round is noted on the official scorecard. *It is each group's responsibility to maintain a pace faster than the maximum allowable time.*

• Each player should play a stroke within 40 seconds from the time he or she can make a stroke without interference or distraction.

Position of a group

- The first group to start will be considered *out of position* if, at any time during the round, the group's cumulative time exceeds the time allowed for the number of holes played.
- Any following group will be considered out of position if they have exceeded the time allowed for the number of holes played and:
 - A par 3 is clear of play and the group in front has played from the teeing area of the next hole
 - A par 4 becomes clear before any player plays a stroke from the teeing area
 - Or reaches a par 5 after any player in the group ahead has made a stroke on the putting green.

Timing

- A group determined to be out of position will be issued a *1st bad timing*. Each player will then be timed individually, allowing 40 seconds per stroke plus a 10% variance.
- Timing of a players stroke begins when the Player has had:
 - A reasonable opportunity to reach his/her ball
 - It is his/her turn to play and can play their shot without interference or distraction.
 - When on the putting green, has had reasonable time to make allowable actions under Rule 13.1.
 - Time spent determining yardage, wind, and surveying the line of play from behind and the ball and/or beyond the hole when on the putting green will count as time taken to play the stroke.
- Timing will discontinue when group has regained its position.
- Bad times previously recorded will be held over for further occurrence.
- The Rules Committee reserves the right to put an individual on the clock regardless of whether or not the group is out of position.

Pace of Play Penalties

- 1^{st} bad timing = *Warning*
- 2^{nd} bad timing = 1-stoke penalty
- 3^{rd} bad timing = 2-stroke penalty
- 4^{th} bad timing = *disqualification*
